Minutes of the Virtual Provincial Business Meeting held on Saturday 26th September in lieu of the regular meeting scheduled to have been held on Saturday 9th May 2020 during the General Suspension of Masonic Activity arising from the Covid-19 Pandemic.

R.W. Bro. Kevin John Hicks Provincial Grand Master declared the meeting open at precisely 11.00am.

Present: - R.W. Bro. Kevin John Hicks Provincial Grand Master, V.W.Bro. Peter Frederick Johns Deputy Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. Peter John Furness Assistant Provincial Grand Master.

R.W.Bro. G.F.W. Isaac Past Provincial Grand Master; R.W.Bro. B M Hocking, V.W.Bro. A.R. Morby Past Deputy Provincial Grand Masters; other Past Grand Lodge Officers, Present and Past Provincial Grand Lodge Officers; Masters, Past Masters, Wardens, Overseers and Brethren. (A total of 95 in attendance)

Among the Distinguished Brethren – R.W.Bro. Ryan A. Williams Grand Secretary

The letter of permission to hold the Virtual Business Meeting was read by the Provincial Grand Secretary and is attached hereafter to these minutes.

The Minutes of the Provincial Grand Lodge held on the 11th of May 2019 were confirmed by the meeting. This was proposed by W.Bro. Mike Pritchard, Provincial Grand Deputy Secretary and Seconded by W.Bro. Trevor Conroy, Provincial Grand Assistant Secretary.

The Past Assistant Provincial Grand Master Christopher Hawkey paid tribute to 'Departed Merit' and a Blessing was given by the Provincial Grand Chaplain.

Election of Provincial Grand Treasurer. W.Bro. Kevin Dower of Three Grand Principles Lodge No. 879, being the only nomination, was duly elected as the Provincial Grand Treasurer. He was thanked by the R.W. Provincial Grand Master for his hard work especially in getting the Province performing online banking.

Election of Account Examiners. W.Bro. Anthony Griffiths of St Michael's Lodge No. 175 and W.Bro. Christopher Semmens of Love and Honour Lodge No. 94, being the only nominations, were elected as the two Account Examiners. Both were thanked by the R.W. Provincial Grand Master for their hard work.

The report of the Provincial Grand Treasurer, W.Bro. K.A.J. Dower, for the year ending 31st August 2019 was then presented. It was proposed by W.Bro. Mike Pritchard, Provincial Grand Deputy Secretary and Seconded by W.Bro. Trevor Conroy, Provincial Grand Assistant Secretary that they be adopted and confirmed by the meeting.

The Provincial Grand Charity Steward W. Bro J.E.F. Mills presented his report for the year ending 31st December 2019. It was proposed by W.Bro. Mike Pritchard, Provincial Grand Deputy Secretary and Seconded by W.Bro. Trevor Conroy, Provincial Grand Assistant Secretary that they be adopted and confirmed by the meeting with thanks to the Provincial Charity Steward and the Auditors.

The Deputy Provincial Grand Master V.W.Bro. Peter Frederick Johns presented a list of members awarded collarettes by the Mark Benevolent Fund and thanked all the Brethren for their continued support.

The Provincial Grand Almoner's report was received from W.Bro. Alan Odgers.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master Confirmed W.Bro. Kingsley Wright of Fortitude Lodge No 78, W.Bro. Brian Roach of Tregenna Lodge No 787 and W.Bro. Colin Adams of St Nicholas Lodge No 1188, as recipients of the Provincial Grand Masters Certificate of Service to Mark Masonry. The PGM thanked them for their long service to the Mark.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master confirmed the reappointment of V.W.Bro. Peter Frederick Johns as Deputy Provincial Grand Master thanking him for his support.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master confirmed the appointment of W.Bro. Peter John Furness as Assistant Provincial Grand Master. He then thanked W.Bro. Christopher John Hawkey the Past Assistant Provincial Grand Master for all the hard work and dedication over the years.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master confirmed the appointments to Active Provincial Grand Rank, Past Provincial Grand Rank, Promotions and Provincial Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master addressed the Brethren:

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master opened his address by urging all of the Brethren to act upon two of the fundamentals of Freemasonry, Brotherly Love and Charity. Thanks were expressed to the Mark Provincial and Grand Lodge Executive for all their considerable hard work during this unprecedented time, of particular note the Monthly Newsletters and the Cornwall Mark Masons website.

A survey had been put together for sending to all members and the R.W. Provincial Grand Master asked all the Brethren to support it by completing it as soon as possible. The survey will give an indication of the general feeling of the Brethren with respect to returning to normal business.

Zoom meetings have been very successful at Provincial and Grand level and the R.W. Provincial Grand Master asked that all Lodges consider having social/business meetings with those members who are able to make use of this platform, but not to forget about those who may not be so IT capable and maintain contact by phone.

A copy of the address is attached to these minutes.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master introduced the Grand Secretary, R.W. Bro Ryan Williams, who addressed the Brethren:

The R.W. Grand Secretary conveyed the good wishes of the Grand Master to all present. It has been a turbulent period for Masonry since March and there is nothing to refer to as to how to conduct our business, there is no handbook to guide us. He had checked back through the archives and found little to go on and Grand Lodge have been working hard to develop policies using the Book of Constitutions for guidance. On the 17th of March a general suspension was issued, which was reviewed in July with a decision to allow it to expire on the 17th of July. As the future was uncertain it did not make sense to extend the suspension further as this could lead to losing members as time goes by. Some Lodges had resumed at that time, but this was very regional with the South East having resumed most meetings but Wales and the South West unable to do so. Guidance on holding Virtual Business Meeting (VBM) was issued and this has proved very successful at Lodge and Provincial level. It is not about being rule bound and

inflexible, more about keeping the business of Lodges going. With the "rule of 6" being introduced, this put a different slant on things and although the Craft and Royal Arch allow the Tyler/Janitor to be an additional to the 6.

within the Lodge/Chapter, the Mark stipulated that “6 means 6” but the Tyler may double up as an Officer inside the Temple. VBMs came in earlier in the year and have proved very successful and well used allowing Lodges to transact important administrative tasks, it also means we get to see each other and chat, however we must not forget those who are not so IT enabled and must think about maintaining contact with them as well. Grand Lodge were looking at Retention and Recruitment and have made some adjustments to fees, a freeze on any increase in Annual dues for the year, Registration fee reduced by half and Joining fees also reduced by half. The attrition rate of memberships this year was far better than expected with the numbers of members only down by 2.25 % and the number of memberships down by only 2%. Royal Ark Mariner numbers were members down by 1.5% and memberships down by only 2%. These figures were less than the average annual figures. A new process had been put in place for Resignations, which now involves the Provincial Grand Master contacting those who have expressed their wish to resign, guidance for which had been issued recently, and it is hoped that this may well reduce the number of resignations. R.W. Bro. Kevin John Hicks Provincial Grand Master has joined the board of trustees for the MBF, and the MBF have been supporting organisations recently which are Covid related. The MBF were now looking at future major grant projects and not specifically looking for one large ticket but may look to fund a number of key organisations. The Grand Secretary also thanked the brethren for their continued support of the MBF and congratulated those who had been awarded collarettes. Thanks were expressed to all of the Lodge Almoners and Charity Stewards for their hard work. Masonry is facing its toughest time and we have to look forward and be optimistic. The Grand Secretary thanked the R.W. Provincial Grand Master for inviting him to address the Brethren and opened the floor to any questions.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master thanked the Grand Secretary for a very informative address and for all the hard work that MMH were doing for the Order. In summing up the R.W. Provincial Grand Master welcomed all the Active Provincial Officers and thanked the outgoing Active Provincial Officers for their support over the last year. The R.W. Provincial Grand Master called for us all to support the young and the old and to be the “Mark Community”.

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master called upon the Provincial Grand Chaplain for a closing prayer.

R.W. Bro. Kevin John Hicks Provincial Grand Master declared the meeting closed at 11.50am.

The Grand Secretary has advised a short address today, so I will talk quickly.

Brethren, I am now, as you know in my Seventh year as your Provincial Grand Master, and what an unsettling year it has been so far. The pandemic is probably the most serious threat to Masonry in generations, but I ask you all to act on the fundamentals of freemasonry at this time, Brotherly Love and Charity.

The past few months have been very hard on us all, but I would particularly like to thank the Provincial and Grand Lodge executives for their amazing efforts during this time, and particularly the Grand Secretary and his “Special Circumstances” approach to the book of constitutions, which has led to, at least, some form of Masonry and is much appreciated by us all.

We are experiencing a very difficult time in the history of freemasonry which is likely to continue for some time, and I ask you all to be patient and diligent. Hopefully you have seen that your Provincial Executive, and our Grand Lodge Executive, are fully aware of the problems you are all experiencing and are working extremely hard to make the various transitions to a “new way”, as seamless as possible. To continue that effort, I have asked that the Province conducts a survey in order to gauge your thoughts on Mark Masonry and how Covid 19 will affect you all going forward. This survey will be sent to ALL members over this weekend and I ask for your support in completing it.

I also express my thanks on behalf of all the brethren to all the Mark executive for their considerable hard work, and particularly the Secretariat for the production of the extremely professional monthly Newsletters, of which our Provincial secretary has, along with others, had a major input, and also the refreshing of the Provincial website which also is very professional (Thank you Trevor).

Over the past year, yet again, we have experienced many highlights including Provincial workings, advancing two Craft Assistant PGM’s, presentations to the Sowenna appeal on behalf of the MBF and the Province totalling £13k, and many other donations to local charities totalling £23k, and we also had a wonderful service in Truro Cathedral at the official dedication of the St John Ambulance support vehicle and recently we help a Provincial golf tournament organised by Rob Brook which raised almost £800. Thank you Rob.

I thank, as usual each individual Lodges executive for all their hard work at this very difficult time but I do ask all Lodge secretaries to consider at least a Social Zoom or a business meeting on your Lodge meeting days, it is vital that we all keep in contact with each other at this time, and I ask you all not to forget those brethren who don't or can't embrace I.T.

It has been a great pleasure to reappoint my Deputy Provincial Grand Master V.W.Bro. Peter Johns and to appoint my new Assistant Provincial Grand Master W. Bro Peter Furness and I look forward to working with them to make this Province stronger.

I also thank W Bro Chris Hawkey for his brilliant service as Assistant PGM over the last six years and hopefully I will be able to thank him properly at the St Columba centenary meeting whenever it is held, and I look forward to continuing to work with him in his new role.

Brethren I also welcome the presence of some of our new advancees today. Welcome to the Mark degree brethren, I hope you have many years' enjoyment in this wonderful order of ours. I assure you it's going to get a lot better, eventually.

I also once again thank the outgoing team of Provincial Officers for their support and commitment during this curtailed year. It has been another very memorable year in attending the many Provincial visits and Installations in record numbers.

I also congratulate those Brethren who have been given first appointments or promoted in Provincial Grand Lodge in May which as you now know will now be for two years. I look forward to their support for myself, the Deputy and Assistant PGM and those Brethren representing me. I also welcome those who would have received my certificate of service to Mark Masonry, I thank you for your service and I as I said earlier will present your certificates sometime in the future.

I confirm to Provincial Grand Lodge that Grand Lodge this year the MW the Grand Master has been pleased to confer three new first appointments, Adrian Waters, Jim Redman and James Wonacott. all who have done great service behind the scenes.

Also, well-deserved promotions to PGJO for Peter Cheeseman our very capable and hardworking Past Provincial Charity Steward and of course to our Provincial Secretary to the rank of active Junior Deacon, which is likely to be for two years, Well done all.

I would also again congratulate John Penpraze and again Simon Trevains on their promotion to Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank last December, again very well deserved. This years Royal Ark Mariner appointments are out today, does either of them have something to say? Post a bit slow in Cornwall.

Brethren at this stage I would like to welcome again our very hardworking Grand Secretary Rt Worshipful Ryan Williams who will give us a SHORT report and I gather will answer questions.

Thank you, Grand Secretary, and for those of you that look at our website "Cornwall Mark Masons" I would recommend, under the news section the tour of 86 St James given by Dan Heath, its very informative and for the eagle eyed of you will be able to see the Cornish Provincial Window in the main Temple.

That's its brethren, hopefully next year we can have a more regular meeting, thank you once again for your attendance on this Zoom meeting here today. In deciding to hold this meeting today I considered several factors, but the overriding purpose was not necessarily a Masonic one. It is crucial for our own personal and our family's wellbeing that we converse and interact either by Phone, email or Zoom type media to ALL our members. I propose therefore to hold Social Provincial Zoom meetings at least a Bimonthly going forward until restrictions are relaxed.

That's its Brethren. May the Great Overseer of the Universe bless you all and give me the strength, wisdom and understanding to lead this wonderful Province of ours and brethren BE SAFE.

Provincial Almoners Report 2020-2021

Well as we move into twelve months without any masonic activity, we must all wonder what Freemasonry is going to be like when we do eventually resume. I personally hope that Grand Lodge will hold their nerve and not dash head-long into re-opening at the absolute earliest date. I think that the Brethren must have confidence in the

Hygiene and preventive measures that their respective Lodge Trustees or Managers have put in place. Unless sensible efforts are made, wives and families are going to be very uneasy about allowing us as a generality to return. I think CONFIDENCE is the watchword! of course with the Covid vaccine up-take nationally, I think that all of us are pinning our hopes that we may have some resistance to withstand the dreaded 'bug', I hope that Lodges will suggest that only Brethren who have had the vaccinations be allowed to attend. I say this because I read that there are significant numbers who have refused them; I for one would not want to be put at risk mixing with them.

On the family side, should the worst happen, such as bereavement, medical diagnosis, loss of income it is hoped that our members would know where to receive help should they need or want it. I think that last phrase is very important 'should they need or want it'. I have now spoken to a number of members and their dependants and have offered assistance should they so require, and I have to say very few do actually request help. It could be pride and self-reliance that does not let them ask for help. So, I see it as beholden on all of us to try to make any potential recipients aware of the depth and help available from the MBF and of course the Masonic Charitable Foundation, and also the confidentiality in the manner that we conduct our roles. I draw special attention here to Mental Health issues and to always bear in mind that the Masonic Charitable Foundation have a specific set-up to deal with this illness which the Mark Charities do not; so be conscious that liaison with the particular brother's Craft Lodge Almoner might be a positive action to help the Brother.

I continue to receive constant help from V.W.Bro' s Peter Johns and Ray Lewry who have developed a close liaison with their area Almoners, as I have with mine. I thank them for their assistance and feel that we have a fairly good overview of the vulnerable members within our ranks right now and that generally their local Almoners are watchful of them.

We are aware, of course, of the loss of several members, some very prominent, in many cases due to 'Tempus Fugit' but, generally speaking, I am glad to say that as a Province we have not done too badly regarding Covid – so far. I guess we must keep enforcing the knowledge of the risk the dreaded virus can pose and always take care. Encourage the vaccinations uptake.

I am always available to try to assist if required brethren – you have but to ask.
